### GRANTS TO VOLUNTARY ORGANISATIONS

#### **1. PURPOSE OF REPORT**

- 1.1 To consider a request by The Kidderminster Valentines for a Grant to assist with the purchase of sheet music for use at charity fund raising concerts.

#### **2. RECOMMENDATION**

**The Cabinet is asked to DECIDE :-**

- 2.1 A Grant of £300 to The Kidderminster Valentines.

#### **3. BACKGROUND**

- 3.1 Council on 23rd February, 2005, agreed as part of the Budget Process, a Budget Allocation of £1,000 to provide Grants to Voluntary Organisations in order to Pump Prime projects.
- 3.2 A request has been received from The Kidderminster Valentines (copy included as Appendix 1) for a grant of £300 towards their estimated costs in 2005/2006 of £600 of purchasing sheet music for use at charity fund raising concerts.
