Proposal	Application for a Premises Licence to be granted under the Licensing Act 2003.

**BEWDLEY PIZZA PARLOUR, ( Royal Sangam Balti House), 3, LOAD STREET, BEWDLEY, WORCESTERSHIRE, DY12 2AF.**

**1. Application**

- 1.1 An application was received on Monday January 23rd, 2006, from Fariborz Gohari in respect of Bewdley Pizza Parlour, 3, Load Street, Bewdley, DY12 2AF.

*The application was for a Premises Licence to be granted under the Licensing Act 2003.*

**2. Current Licence**

- 2.1 There is no current licence in force in respect of the premises applying.

**3. Licensable Activities Proposed To Carry On From The Premises**

- 3.1 Provision of Late Night Refreshment.

**4.1 Hours premises are open to the public.**

As per Late Night Refreshment 3.2 above.

**5.0 Background Information.**

- 5.1 Well established business premises of a terraced nature in the centre of Load Street, Bewdley. The premises are on the ground floor and operate as a take away facility providing hot and cold food and drink.

The premises are of traditional brick construction in close proximity to all amenities and comprise of retail area to the front affording access to the public, corridor and storage rooms to the rear to which public access is denied.

5.2 The premises does not have a complaint history in respect of noise pollution.

## 6.0 Plans

6.1 A scale plan of the existing ground floor depicting the layout of the premises is included in the accompanying papers as is a map which has been submitted to show the location of the premises with regard to nearest residences and commercial properties.

## 7.0 Public Notice

7.1 Public notice was given by the applicant commencing Monday January 23rd, 2006, for a period of 28 days, terminating on Monday February 20<sup>th</sup>,2006.

7.2 The Licensing Act requires the fixing of a notice to the premises adjacent to the highway and by insertion of a Public Notice in a local newspaper circulating in the district. This requirement was complied with at the time of the original application.

## 11.0 Policy considerations

11.1 The following paragraphs of the Wyre Forest Statement of Licensing Policy apply to this application:

Licensing Hours (Paragraph 6.1) [Page 5 of 23]

*"The Licensing Authority will expect stricter conditions with regard to noise control in areas that have denser residential accommodation. This should not limit opening hours without regard to the individual merits of any application".*
