Unfortunately, whilst the roof covering in question is not considered sympathetic or appropriate to the Area, as the buildings are not Statutory Listed, the Local Authority do not have any powers to enforce on this matter.

The Parish Council are totally against development of this site for 10 apartments, intensive development is wholly inappropriate to the area.</p> <p>The reference to public parking is inaccurate, the Queens Head Car Park is private and there is not a lot of public parking within Wolverley</p>	<p>Whilst it is appreciated that there is strong feeling within the Area regarding this site, any comments made on any application for this site will be taken into consideration.</p> <p>The reference to car-parking does not relate to public car-parking. The statement is that the area is used as an unofficial car-park, and that considerable parking is available within the vicinity. The strip of land is used by customers of the Queens Head, and others, and the statement was to encourage the use of the car park associated with the pub, rather than this strip of land. No reference to public car-parking has been made in the Appraisal.</p>
