# 1. PURPOSE OF REPORT

- 1.1 To inform Members of the comments and responses received on the Draft SCI during the 6-week Pre-Submission Public Participation Stage, which ended on the 9<sup>th</sup> June.
- 1.2 To seek Members' approval of the proposed schedule of changes to the Draft SCI, resulting from the comments received, for submission to the Secretary of State.

## 2. RECOMMENDATION

#### 2.1 The Cabinet is asked to recommend to Council:

- To approve the Schedule of Responses set out at Appendix 2 to the report to Cabinet and the resulting changes to the Draft Statement of Community Involvement for submission to the Secretary of State.
- To authorise the Head of Planning Health and Environment to make the appropriate arrangements to submit the Statement of Community Involvement to the Secretary of State on 27<sup>th</sup> September to commence the 6-week submission stage of consultation.

#### 2.2 The Cabinet is asked to DECIDE that:

- The Local Development Scheme for Wyre Forest District be revised to reflect the revised timetable for the preparation of the Statement of Community Involvement as set out in paragraph 4.2 of the Report.
- That subject to not receiving any notification from the Secretary of State, under Regulation 11 (3b or 3c) of the Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulations 2004, the submitted revised Local Development Scheme shall have effect from 30<sup>th</sup> August 2005.

# 3. **BACKGROUND**

- 3.1 Members will recall the Cabinet report of the 14<sup>th</sup> April, which outlined details of the Draft SCI and of the timetable for its development. The report referred to the Presubmission Informal Consultation period undertaken during early March (required by Regulation 25 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulations 2004). It also outlined details of arrangements for the 6-week PreSubmission Participation stage in the preparation of the SCI (required by Regulation 26 of the Town & Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulations 2004); which commenced on 28<sup>th</sup> April ending on 9<sup>th</sup> June 2005.
- 3.2 The informal consultation, which sought comments on an initial draft of the SCI, was undertaken in early March and involved all the Parish Councils within and directly adjoining the District; all local authorities adjoining the District; the West Midlands Regional Assembly and the Highways Agency. A number of responses were received during this early stage and these were generally incorporated into the Draft SCI. The response schedule, detailing how these comments were addressed, is detailed at Appendix 1 for Members' information.

- 3.3 Extensive consultation was undertaken for the six-week Pre-Submission participation stage in order to publicise the Draft SCI and to obtain the local communities' views on it. A public notice was published in the Kidderminster Shuttle which formally commenced the consultation period and press releases were published in the local newspapers to advertise the Draft SCI. The document, summary leaflet and an interactive response form were placed on the website and also on deposit at Council offices and local libraries. Over 400 notification letters were sent out along with informative summary leaflets. These were generated from the database of statutory, general and individual consultees. In addition, Forward Planning Officers gave a presentation to the Better Environment working group of the Local Strategic Partnership on 11<sup>th</sup> May. This outlined the background to the SCI and the new planning system and encouraged LSP Members to submit their responses on the draft document.
- 3.4 159 individual responses were received from 42 respondents and these are outlined in the response schedule detailed at Appendix 2, which also sets out Officers' comments and the resulting recommendations for changes to the Draft SCI before its submission. Of the responses, 118 were comments, 20 were objections and 20 were supporting statements. Most were general comments in relation to the document; a number of respondents outlined groups and individuals for inclusion in the list of consultees at Appendix 1 of the SCI and made comments concerning the proposed methods of consultation.
- 3.5 The Council's Environment and Economic Regeneration Policy and Scrutiny Panel are due to consider the comments on the Draft SCI at their meeting on 21<sup>st</sup> July, any suggested amendments will be reported verbally.

#### 4. TIMETABLE FOR SCI DEVELOPMENT

- 4.1 The remaining stages for the development of the SCI as included in the Local Development Scheme are outlined below:
  - Submission of SCI to Secretary of State August 2005
  - Independent Examination November 2005
  - Adoption February 2006
- 4.2 Recently GOWM have advised that the Office for the Deputy Prime Minister (ODPM) is of the firm view that the Regulations require submission SCIs to be formally approved by full Council. Your Officers consider the Regulations on this issue appear ambiguous, however in order to avoid a potential subsequent legal challenge to the SCI, it is recommended that the submission SCI be reported to next full Council for formal approval. Currently, the next full Council is scheduled for 21<sup>st</sup> September 2005, this would result in the following revised timetable:
  - Submission of SCI to Secretary of State –September 2005
  - Independent Examination –January 2006
  - Adoption April 2006
- 4.3 The Local Development Scheme will need to be the subject of a minor revision to incorporate this revised timetable.

## 5. SUBMISSION TO THE SECRETARY OF STATE

5.1 It is intended that following Council approval, the SCI will be submitted, along with a Statement of Pre-Submission Consultation on the SCI undertaken by the District Council, for independent examination in January 2006. A notice will be published in the local press and representations will be invited on the submitted statement for a specified 6-week period commencing on 27<sup>th</sup> September 2005, in accordance with Regulation 28 of The Town and Country Planning (Local Development) (England) Regulations 2004.

## 6. TESTING THE SOUNDNESS OF THE SCI

- 6.1 Planning Policy Statement 12 (Paragraph 3.10), sets out nine tests of soundness with which SCI's should comply. The Planning Inspector will use these to assess whether or not the SCI is sound. These are as follows:
  - i) Local Planning Authority (LPA) has complied with the minimum requirements for consultation as set out in the Regulations.
  - ii) LPA's strategy for community involvement links with other community involvement initiatives e.g. the community strategy.
  - iii) Statement identifies in general terms which local community groups and other bodies will be consulted.
  - iv) Statement identifies how the community and other bodies can be involved in a timely and accessible manner.
  - v) Methods of consultation to be employed are suitable for the intended audience and for the different stages in the preparation of local development documents
  - vi) Resources are available to manage community involvement effectively
  - vii) Statement shows how the results of community involvement will be fed into the preparation of development plan documents and supplementary planning documents.
  - viii) Authority has mechanisms for reviewing the statement of community involvement
  - ix) Statement clearly describes the planning authority's policy for consultation on planning applications.
- 6.2 The Planning Inspectorate's document "A Framework for Assessing Soundness and Focusing Representations on Development Plan Documents and Statements of Community Involvement" states that LPA's should seek to submit SCIs, which they are satisfied are sound having regard to the nine tests set out above. Officers are of the opinion that the SCI, along with the incorporated recommended amendments resulting from the pre-submission consultation, does meet the tests of soundness set out above.

## 7. THE EXAMINATION PROCESS

7.1 Since the SCI is a document concerned with process rather than policy, it is anticipated that most SCIs will be examined by means of written representations rather than hearings. The Planning Inspectorate has stated that most deficiencies identified in SCIs should be capable of remedy by a change to the document subject to the evidence being made available to the Inspector. Should a hearing be required, this would be dealt with informally through round table discussions and joint hearings.

#### 8. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

8.1 The costs of preparing and publishing the SCI can be met from within existing budget.

# 9. **LEGAL AND POLICY IMPLICATIONS**

9.1 The Draft SCI has been prepared to accord with the necessary legal requirements.

#### 10. **RISK MANAGEMENT**

10.1 The failure to adhere to the key milestones set out in the Local Development Scheme for the preparation of the SCI could have adverse financial implications for the future level of Planning Delivery Grant received. It will also indicate less than satisfactory performance when the related BVPI is reported.

#### 11. CONCLUSION

- 11.1 The Pre-Submission consultation arrangements undertaken by the District Council for the SCI have been undertaken in accordance with Regulations 25 and 26 of The Town and Country (Local Development) (England) Regulations 2004.
- 11.2 A reasonable response to the consultation on the Draft SCI has been received and all comments and objections have been taken into account by Officers when developing the list of proposed amendments to the Draft SCI for submission.
