Footpath Diversion to the side of 1A Damson Way, Bewdley: Footpath No. 552 (part) Bewdley

1. PURPOSE

1.1 To seek approval to an application for a Footpath Diversion Order under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 and to authorise the Solicitor to the Council to make such an Order recommendation.

2. **RECOMMENDATION**

2.1 Authority to be delegated to the Solicitor to the Council to take such steps as are necessary to make and (if unopposed) confirm a Footpath Diversion Order in relation to Footpath 552 (Part) Bewdley to the side of 1A Damson Way, Bewdley.

3. BACKGROUND

- 3.1 Details and reasons for the application are as follows:
 - 3.1.1 The Diversion is required as the current line of Footpath 552, Bewdley runs through the dwelling house and garden situated at 1A Damson Way, Bewdley.
 - 3.1.2 The Footpath to be diverted is situated on land which is currently owned by the applicant Brian Adrian Raine and Jennifer Ann Raine.
 - 3.1.3 The Applicants built the dwelling house at 1A Damson Way in 1988-89. The Applicants were not aware of the existence of the Footpath (notwithstanding the usual searches had been completed) until it was brought to their attention on their proposed sale of the property (which sale has subsequently aborted as a result of the existence of the Footpath). Prior to this, at no time before (to the applicants knowledge) or since the house was constructed, has any person requested walking the definitive route of Footpath 552 (Bewdley) to the extent that the line

- runs through the dwelling house and garden at 1A Damson Way, Bewdley.
- 3.1.4 The Applicants are aware that the public have for many years used the route which is the requested diversion route. This route is laid out as a public footpath and is convenient for walkers as it avoids crossing through the residential dwelling house and follows an accessible well defined route.
- 3.1.5 The diversion route applied for has already been accepted by the public as the route (and has been maintained as such) for many years. This application therefore merely requests regularisation.
- 3.1.6 The diverted route of the Footpath crosses land not in the ownership of the Applicant. The Owners of that land, Wyre Forest Community Housing, have consented to Diversion Order being made.
- 3.1.7 The plan attaches the location of the existing Footpath route by the blue dotted line between the points marked A and B. The plan attached also shows the proposed diversion by the red dotted line between the points marked A to C to B.
- 3.1.8 Initial consultation with all parties required pursuant to the legislation has already been undertaken. No objections have been received to the proposals.

4. FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 4.1 The applicant has signed an agreement to indemnify the Council against all costs that may be incurred by it in relation to the application in full.
- 4.2 Therefore, there will be no financial implications for the Council in dealing with the application.

5. **LEGAL AND POLICY IMPLICATIONS**

- 5.1 Section 119 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1990 empowers the Council to make an Order authorising the Diversion of a Footpath where it appears "in the interests of the Owner, Lessee or Occupier of land crossed by the path or way or of the public, it is expedient that the line of the path or way or part of that line, should be diverted".
- 5.2 A series of protections exist for members of the public to ensure that Footpath Diversions are only agreed in limited circumstances. The legislation contains an obligation on the Council to advertise the Diversion at several stages of the procedure, to consult (including initial consultation which has already taken place) with statutory bodies and others and the public have an opportunity to object to the Diversion. Ultimately (if there is an objection which is not

withdrawn) the Order will be referred to the Secretary of State for a Decision. If no objections are received then Wyre Forest District Council may confirm the Order.

6. CONCLUSION

- 6.1 The Applicants have applied to have the Footpath Number 552 (Bewdley) diverted in part as the current line runs through their dwelling house. Accordingly, as the Footpath is currently not passable and as the public are currently using an alternative route on the adjoining land it would appear to be in both the interests of the Applicants as owners of the land crossed by the path and the members of the public, and expedient to do so, for the route of the Footpath to be diverted to regularise the route which is currently (and has for many years been) used by the public for crossing between points A and B on the plan attached to this report.
- 6.2 That the Council will not be burdened with the cost of making the Diversion Order.
- 6.3 That the Committee resolve that the Solicitor to the Council make an Order and Confirm the Order if it is unopposed.

7. RISK MANAGEMENT

There are no risk management issues arising from this report.

8. EQUALITY IMPACT NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Any footpaths diverted need to be of a minimum width; this application complies with these requirements and therefore a further assessment is not required.

PUBLIC PATH DIVERSION ORDER UNDER HIGHWAYS ACT 1980, SECTION 119

WYRE FOREST DISTRICT COUNCIL (PUBLIC FOOTPATHS, No. 522 (PART) BEWDLEY) DIVERSION ORDER 2014

This Order is made by Wyre Forest District Council ("the Authority") under Section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 ("the 1980 Act") because it appears to the Authority that in the interests of the owner of the land crossed by the footpath described in paragraph 1 of this order it is expedient that the line of the path should be diverted.

The owner has agreed to defray any compensation which becomes payable in consequence of the coming into force of this Order and any expenses which are incurred in bringing the new site of the footpath into a fit condition for use by the public.

The Worcestershire County Council has been consulted and the Worcestershire County Council has consented to the making of the Order as required by Section 120(2) of the 1980 Act.

BY THIS ORDER:

- 1. The public right of way over the land situate at Bewdley and shown by a blue dotted line on the map contained in this Order and described in Part 1 of the Schedule to this Order shall be stopped up after 14 days from the date of confirmation of this Order.
- Where immediately before the date on which the footpath is diverted there is apparatus under, in, on, over, along or across it belonging to statutory undertakers for the purpose of carrying on their undertaking, the undertakers shall continue to have the same rights in respect of the apparatus as they then had.
- 3. There shall at the end of 14 days from the date of confirmation of this Order be a public footpath over the land situate at Bewdley described in Part 2 of the Schedule and shown by a red dotted line on the map contained in this Order.

SCHEDULE

PART 1

Description of Site of Existing Path or Way

That part of Footpath No. 522 commencing in the Parish of Bewdley at point **A** (Grid Reference 379058, 275761) proceeding in a northerly direction for approximately 37 metres to point **B** (Grid Reference 379065, 275800) along the blue dotted line.

The route is more particularly described as, "starting at a point to the north-east corner of the electricity substation off Grey Green Lane, Bewdley where there is a 1 metre high concrete post positioned on the centre line of the existing footpath (notated as "post" on the OS plan) Footpath No. 522 runs up a steep incline for the first 8 metres, passing through Point A and continues in a straight line to Point B."

From Point **A** to Point **B** along the blue dotted line Footpath No 522 is currently inaccessible and there is no demarcation of it on the ground. The width of Footpath No. 522 is unclear between Point **A** and Point **B**.


Description of Site of New Path or Way

The proposed new route of Footpath No 522 is approximately 42 metres along the red dotted line commencing in the Parish of Bewdley point **A** (Grid Reference 379058, 275761) proceeding first in a north north easterly direction for approximately 28 metres to Point **C** (Grid Reference 379069, 275785) then proceeding in a north north westerly direction until it rejoins the existing footpath at point **B** (Grid Reference 379065, 275800).

From Point **A** to Point **C** to Point **B** along the red dotted line there is an available width of 2 metres comprising of both tarmac and grass surfaces. The width of the tarmac varies from 1.2 metres to 2.5 metres. The minimum width of the proposed new route of Footpath No 522 shall be not less than 2 metres.
